InterRail India facilitates transport from India to Russia via North-South Transport Corridor

InterRail India Pvt. Ltd, registered in Mumbai, has introduced transport from India to Russia via the North-South Transport Corridor (NSTC). Recently, the first containers ex Bangalore were sent to Nhava Sheva, and from there via sea to Iran's Bandar Abbas port, then by land to Vorsino, Russia. The old route takes an average 45 days. Going via Bandar Abbas, transit times are between 22 and 30 days.

Traffic via the NSTC has increased again with the relaxing of the sanctions imposed on Iran, and therefore new transit goods flows from India to Central Asia as well as Russia via Iran are expected. In the meantime, for customers in India with export to the CIS, transport routed via the Baltic, the Chinese and the Black Sea ports have become interesting, too.

Jayalalithaa was born on 24 February 1948 at Melukote, in Karnataka to Jayaram and Vedavalli in a Tamil Brahmin (Iyengar) family. She completed her education at Sacred Heart Matriculation School it is also known as Church Park Presentation Convent. She won Gold State Award for coming first in 10th standard in the state of Tamil Nadu.

Jayalalitha was trained in Carnatic music, western classical piano and various forms of classical dance, like Bharatanatyam, Mohiniyattam, Manipuri and Kathak. Her Guru for Bharatnatyam and dance forms was K.J. Sarasa. She became an accomplished dancer and gave her debut dance performance at the Rasika Ranjani Sabha in Mylapore in May 1960.



Shivaji Ganesan, Chief Guest at the Arangetram offered her a role in films. Jayalalithaa acted in the Kannada-language film Sri Shaila Mahathme (1961). She made her debut in Tamil theatre in April 1964, when she played a sales girl in the drama named Undersecretary. She was the first heroine to appear in skirts in Tamil films. She starred in 28 box-office hit films with M.G. Ramachandran between 1965 and 1973. The first with MGR was B.R. Panthalu's Aayirathil Oruvan in 1965 and their last film together was Pattikaattu Ponnaiya in 1973.

She had 11 successful releases in Tamil in 1966. Jayalalithaa won the Tamil Nadu State Film Award for Best Actress for Thanga Gopuram in 1971, Raman Thediya Seethai in 1972, Suryagandhi in 1973, Thirumangalyam in 1974, Yarukkum Vetkam Illai in 1975.

In 1982, she joined the AIADMK, which was founded by MGR. Her maiden public speech, "Pennin Perumai" ("The Greatness of a Woman"), was delivered at the AIADMK's political conference in the same year. In 1983, she became propaganda secretary for the party and was selected as its candidate in the by-election for the Tiruchendur Assembly constituency. Jayalalithaa was nominated and elected in Rajya Sabha in 1984 and retained her seat until 1989.

She was elected to the Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly in 1989 as a representative of the Bodinayakkanur (State Assembly Constituency). In 1991, her alliance with the Indian National Congress enabled her to ride the wave of sympathy that gave the coalition victory. She became the first female, and the youngest, Chief Minister, of Tamil Nadu, to serve a full term, serving from 24 June 1991 to 12 May 1996.



In March 2003, Jayalalithaa assumed the position of Chief Minister once more, having been acquitted of some charges by the Madras High Court. In April 2011, the AIADMK was part of a 13-party alliance that won the 14th state assembly elections. Jayalalithaa was sworn in as the Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu for the third time on 16 May 2011, having been elected unanimously as the leader of the AIADMK party subsequent to those elections.

Jayalalithaa was again elected as Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu in the May 2016 elections. She retained the R. K. Nagar constituency with a margin of 39,545 votes over her DMK rival. She became the first leader in Tamil Nadu to serve consecutive terms as Chief Minister since the death of MGR in 1987. In her victory speech, she commented, "Even when 10 parties allied themselves against me, I did not have a coalition and I placed my faith in God and built an alliance with the people. It is clear that the people have faith in me and I have total faith in the people".

This multi-faceted personality left us on the 5th December 2016 after a prolonged illness. She created history in Indian Politics.
