THE PROFILE

ABRAHAM LINCOLN

The 16th president of United States from (March 1861 until his assassination in April 1865). Born on February 12, 1809, the second child of Thomas and Nancy Hanks Lincoln. Largely self-educated, he became a lawyer in Illinois, a Whig Party leader, and was elected to the Illinois House of Representatives, in which he served for eight years.

He was a keen reader and retained a lifelong interest in learning. Family, neighbours and schoolmates of Lincoln's youth recalled that he read and reread the King James Bible, Aesop's Fables, Bunyan's The Pilgrim's Progress, Defoe's Robinson Crusoe, Weems's The Life of Washington and Franklin's Autobiography, among others.

In 1860, Lincoln secured the Republican Party presidential nomination as a moderate from a swing state. Though he gained very little support in the slaveholding states of the South, he swept the North and was elected president in 1860. Lincoln's victory prompted seven southern slave states to form the Confederate States of America before he moved into the White House, no compromise or settlement was found regarding slavery and secession. His speech Gettysburg Address became an iconic endorsement of the principles of nationalism, republicanism, equal rights, liberty, and democracy.

In 1846, Lincoln was elected to the U.S. House of Representatives, where he served two-year term. He was the only Whig in the Illinois assignment, but he showed his party loyalty by participating in almost all votes and making speeches that echoed the party line. Lincoln, in collaboration with opponent Congressman Joshua R. Giddings, wrote a bill to abolish slavery in the District of Columbia with reimbursement for the owners, enforcement to capture short slaves, and a popular vote on the matter. He abandoned the bill when it failed to garner sufficient Whig supporters.

Lincoln returned to practice law in Springfield, handling every kind of business that could come before a prairie lawyer. Twice a year for 16 years, 10 weeks at a time, he appeared in county seats in the mid-state region when the county courts were in session. Lincoln handled many transportation cases during the nation's western expansion, particularly the conflicts arising from the operation of river barges under the many new railroad bridges.

On November 6, 1860, Lincoln was elected the 16th president of the United States. He was the first president from the Republican Party. His victory was entirely due to the strength of his support in the North and West; no ballots were cast for him in 10 of the 15 Southern slave states, and he won only two of 996 counties in all the Southern states.

10 FASCINATING FACTS ABOUT THE DEAD SEA

The Dead Sea, also known as the Salt Sea, is a salt lake bordering Jordan to the east and Israel and the West Bank to the west.

Here are 10 amazing facts about this unique place.

1. The surface and shores of the Dead Sea are 423 metres (1,388 ft) below sea level, making it Earth's lowest elevation on land.

2. The Dead Sea is 377 m (1,237 ft) deep, making it the deepest hyper saline lake in the world. A hyper saline lake is a landlocked body of water that contains significant concentrations of sodium chloride or other mineral salts, with saline levels surpassing that of ocean water.

3. With 33.7% salinity, the Dead Sea is one of the world's saltiest bodies of water. Although Lake Assal (Djibouti), Garabogazköl and some hyper saline lakes of the McMurdo Dry Valleys in Antarctica (such as Don Juan Pond) have reported higher salinities.

4. The Dead Sea's unusually high salt concentration means that people can easily float in the Dead Sea due to natural buoyancy. In this respect the Dead Sea is similar to the Great Salt Lake in Utah in the United States.

5. The Dead Sea is roughly 8.6 times saltier than the ocean. This salinity makes for a harsh environment in which animals cannot flourish (hence its name). The high salinity prevents macroscopic aquatic organisms such as fish and aquatic plants from living in it, though minuscule quantities of bacteria and microbial fungi are present.

6. The Dead Sea is 67 kilometres (42 mi) long and 18 kilometres (11 mi) wide at its widest point. It lies in the Jordan Rift Valley and its main tributary is the Jordan River.

7. The Dead Sea area has become a major center for health research and treatment for several reasons. The mineral content of the water, the very low content of pollens and other allergens in the atmosphere, the reduced ultraviolet component of solar radiation, and the higher atmospheric pressure at this great depth each have specific health effects.

8. Biblically, the Dead Sea was a place of refuge for King David. It was one of the world's first health resorts (for Herod the Great), and it has been the supplier of a wide variety of products, from balms for Egyptian mummification to potash for fertilizers.

9. An unusual feature of the Dead Sea is its discharge of asphalt. From deep seeps, the Dead Sea constantly spits up small pebbles and blocks of the black substance. Asphalt coated figurines and bitumen coated Neolithic skulls from archaeological sites have been found. Egyptian mummification processes used asphalt imported from the Dead Sea region.

10. The world's lowest road, Highway 90, runs along the Israeli and West Bank shores of the Dead Sea at 393 m (1,289 ft) below sea level.

Know Your Constitution

The Constitution of India is the supreme law of India that lays down the framework defining fundamental political principles, establishes the structure, procedures, powers and duties of government institutions and sets out fundamental rights and the duties of the citizen. It is the longest written constitution of any sovereign in the world.

The Constitution of India, whose chief architect was Dr. B. R. Ambedkar, was adopted by the Constituent Assembly on 26th November 1949 and came into force on 26th January 1950. With its adoption, the Union of India became the modern and contemporary Republic of India replacing the Government of India Act, 1935 as the country's fundamental governing document. At the time that the Constitution commenced, it was divided into 395 articles in 22 parts and 8 schedules with PREAMBLE. India celebrates its coming into force on 26 January each year, as Republic Day.

Date with Dates

Dates have been cultivated since ancient times from Mesopotamia to prehistoric Egypt, possibly as early as 6000 BC. Date palms take about 7 years after planting before they bear fruit, and produce viable yields for commercial harvest after about 10 years. Mature date palms can produce 80-120 kilograms of dates per harvest season. Due to the balanced proportion of magnesium in the date fruit it is eaten for prevention of cancer, taking seven date fruits daily on an empty stomach. It is also taken as a remedy for anemia and loss of blood and for the diseases of the gums.

Next to honey, it is the best purifier and restorative for the colon. The spadix of date palms mixed with honey and made into a paste is taken as a tonic and as a medicine for infertility. Dates are important traditional crops in many Gulf countries and are a staple food of the Middle East for thousands of years. It is a traditional first meal for Muslims when the sun sets during Ramadan. There are approximately 1,500 varieties of dates and this is celebrated every year by the government of UAE through the Liwa Date Festival which signifies palm trees and dates as a symbol of the past's ingenuity and a source of prosperity.
