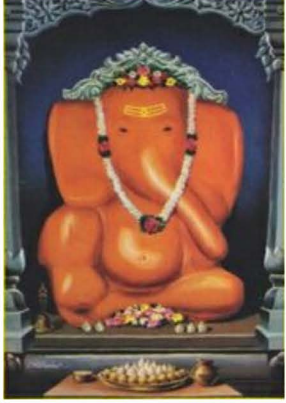

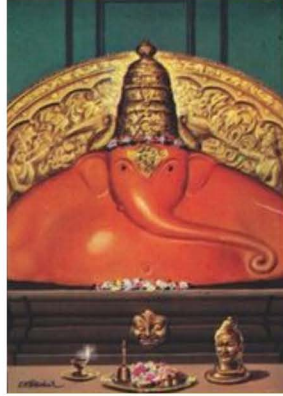


ASHTAVINAYAK TOUR

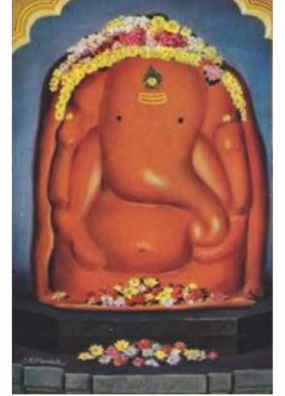

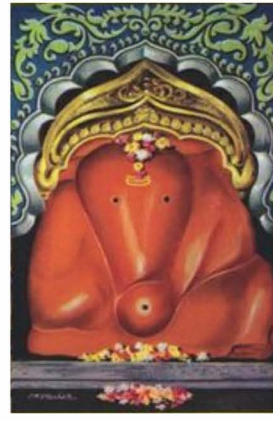

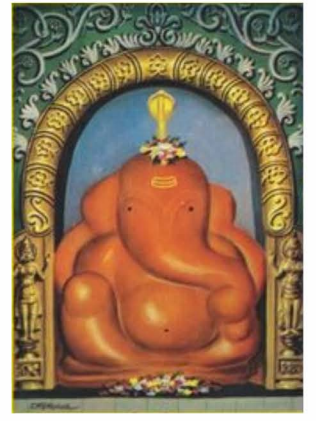

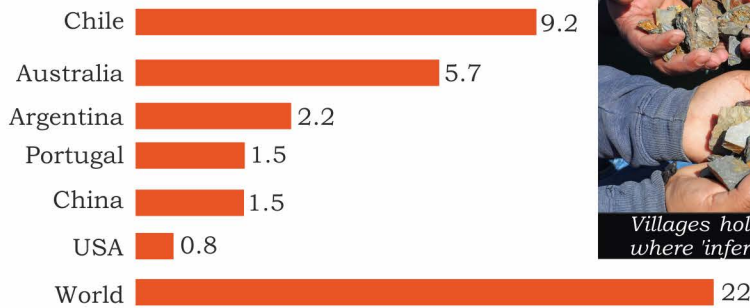
INDIA'S QUEST TO GET ON LITHIUM MAP?

A lot rides on lithium in the age of electric mobility and personal devices. But the lightest metal known to humans is also famously scarce. Hence, the discovery of lithium deposits in J&K could come as a potential game changer for India.

THERE, BUT RARE

Lithium is about half as dense as water and, in its pure, elemental form, is a soft, silvery-white metal. However, being highly reactive, it is never found naturally as a metal. The mineral only “occurs in most rocks as a trace element”. Chile holds the highest reserves of the mineral at 9.2 million tonnes.

Lithium-ion battery demand is expected to increase at a 52.5% compound annual growth rate till 2030

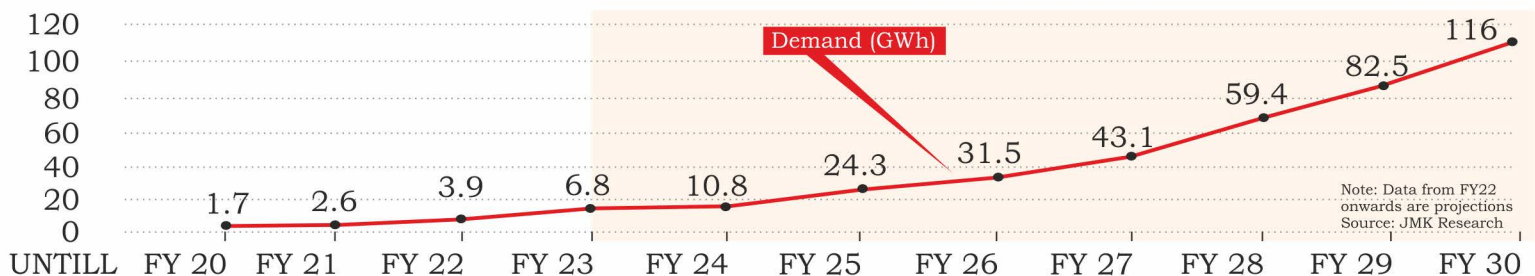
INDIA NEEDS CORE COMPETENCIES

While lithium has many uses, it is added to glass and ceramics for strengthening, alloyed with aluminium and copper to save weight in airframe structures, and also used in certain psychiatric medications. It is currently highly sought after for making batteries for electronic devices and electric and hybrid vehicles. These batteries take advantage of lithium's light weight and high electrochemical potential.

Although the adoption of lithium-ion batteries (LiB) is accelerating in India, domestic manufacturing capability has been limited in this area. Of the total cost of LiBs, cells account for 65%, the battery pack 15% and BMS (battery management system) 15% with the outer box accounting for the rest.

So far, battery packs and associated BMS manufacturing have entirely dominated the space in India and Indian manufacturers, the market in India is fragmented and comprises numerous players are only able to produce the sub-components that go in a battery pack, while thermal pads still need to be imported.

A STEP FORWARD

India has broken new ground in the LiB game with ISRO's Vikram Sarabhai Space Centre having developed and qualified lithium-ion cells of capacities ranging from 1.5Ah to 100Ah for use in satellites and launch vehicles. Following the successful deployment of indigenous LiBs in various missions. ISRO decided to transfer the technology to manufacturers to set up facilities for producing lithium ion cells in the country. The government wants EVs to make up at least 30% of new automobile registrations by 2030 and has focused on developing the value chain for batteries.

A month later, the woman was surprised to see a nice clean wash on the line and said to her husband, "Look, she's finally learned how to wash correctly. I wonder who taught her this?"

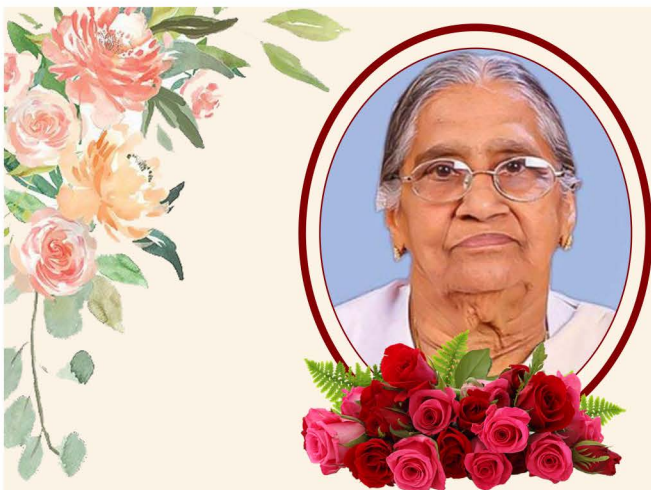

Judging a person does not define who they are. It defines who you are."

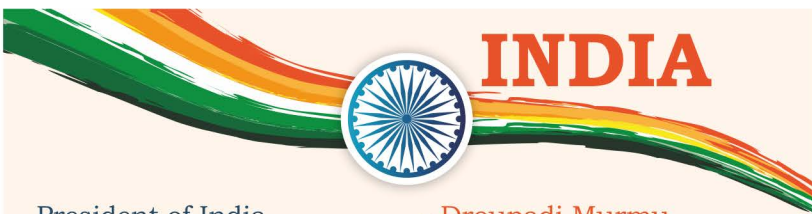
