**Harsha Bhogle** (born 19 July 1961) is an Indian cricket commentator and journalist. He was born into a Marathi-speaking family in Hyderabad. He serves on the board of governors of IIM Udaipur. Harsha Bhogle is the son of A. D. Bhogle, a professor of French, and Shalini Bhogle, a professor of Psychology. Early on, Bhogle played A Div cricket in Hyderabad and represented Osmania University at the Rohinton Baria Tournament. He started commentating at the age of 19 with All India Radio, while living in Hyderabad. In 1991–92, he became the first Indian commentator to be invited by the Australian Broadcasting Corporation during India's cricket series before the 1992 Cricket World Cup.
