Nick Vujicic was born with tetra-amelia syndrome, a rare disorder characterized by the absence of all four limbs. His videos on YouTube have inspired millions and millions of people with his message to love life and live without limits.

He was tormented to such an extent that at the age of 10 he attempted suicide. After years of feeling alone and worthless, he had an epiphany one day while reading an article.He read about a disabled man who refused to let physical limitations dictate his life.

At that moment, Nick says, he realized he had the ability to take control of his life. Instead of looking at everything he lacked, he decided to look at everything he could have. Now a famous author and international speaker,

Nick inspires the world everyday to live a life without limits. His message is brilliantly sobering and electric.

Jessica Cox

Born without arms, she used her legs and her unbelievable spirit of awesomeness to become the first licensed armless pilot. She's also the first armless black belt in the American Taekwondo Association.

Refusing to use prosthetic arms Jessica drives a car, types on a keyboard, pumps her own gas and puts on contact lenses. She also Scuba dives and has a Psychology degree from the University of Arizona. She inspires people across 20 countries by sharing her message of inspiration on stages.



Paulami



12-year-old Paulami could have never foreseen that her family's traditional summer vacation to Hyderabad in 2001 would change her life forever.

That year, a terrible accident left her with 75-80 percent burns and an amputated arm. Paulami was shattered – but not so much that she could give up on life. With her parents as her ultimate pillars of support, this fighter took the reins of her life in her own hands, literally.

Sixteen years and 45 surgeries later, Paulami is perhaps one of the most resilient and strongest persons you will ever meet. She now runs her family business, which deals with heavy machinery, and is happily married to her childhood sweetheart.

"I never thought that I'd meet with an accident and little did I know that it was going to change my life forever. But it happened anyway, and there was nothing anyone could do to undo it. But what I could do was fight back. There were two choices—either give up and drown myself in self-pity or make peace with the situation and face it with a smile. I started seeing everything as an opportunity rather than a hindrance. And that's what made the difference! They say when life presents you with an opportunity; grab it with both the hands. I did the same, just with 1 and a half!"

Bharat Kumar The World Champion para-swimmer, with 50 medals

Born with right hand only Bharat Kumar was born with a right hand by birth, but his physical disability never dissuade him from pursuing his dreams.

Born on Dec 10, 1989, Bharat Kumar, a world champion, has made Bharat (India) proud by winning over 50 medals in paraswimming contests. Achievements: He has won two international titles, one silver at the IWAS World Junior Athletics Championships in Ireland and one gold medal and over 40 national level medals. Young Bharat has flown to countries like England, Ireland, Holland, Malaysia and China to participate in swimming contests.







Girish Sharma

Girish Sharma, a badminton champion, has proved that no matter whatever the circumstances are, you can still be a Champion in your preferred field in your life. The determined boy never let his disability to become an obstacle in achieving his goals.

In an interview, Girish was quoted as saying, "When I was a child, I used to play Cricket, Football, Badminton with normal children of my age. My disability was nowhere near in my mind. I enjoyed those games as much as a normal person does."

Girish, who also rides bicycle, is the proud winner of the Gold Medal in Paraolympic Asia Cup for Disabled in India. Besides, he has also played in Israel, Thailand and in Germany. But shockingly, his commendable out-of-the-world efforts have never been recognised by the Indian government.



Arunima Sinha



27-year-old Arunima Sinha lost her left leg in an unfortunate incident on April 11, 2011. Despite the fact that she lost a leg, she did not gave up the spirit of her life and defied all conceivable odds. Infact, Arunima decided to convert her weakness into her biggest strength and by her true determination, on May 21, 2013, she achieved the rare feat to become the first Indian amputee to conquer the Mount Everest, with the help of a prosthetic leg. Beside setting an example to the world, Arunima also made India, a proud nation when she hoisted the Indian tricolour flag at the peak of the Mount Everest.



Preethi Srinivasan

Preethi Srinivasan was the captain of the under-19 Tamil Nadu women's cricket team. Even after the unfortunate swimming accident that left her paralyzed below the neck, she continues to inspire other lives through her organization Soulfree. She has started to provide hope to women with severe disabilities and assists them in fulfilling their highest human potential by providing a basic quality of life.

H. Boniface Prabhu

Prabhu's life changed at the age of four when a botched lumbar puncture made him a quadriplegic for the rest of his life. But he never let this disability change his goals of life and continued his education in a regular school. His immense hard work and dedication has made him a notable figure and a leading quadriplegic wheelchair tennis player. He was a medal winner at the 1998 World Championships and was also awarded the Padma Shri by Government of India in 2014. It seems like disability is not a word in his dictionary.
