MUMBAI – NAGPUR SAMRUDDHI EXPRESSWAY- A BOON TO MAHARASHTRA



The first leg i.e. Nagpur to Shirdi a 520 km stretch of Mumbai Nagpur Expressway also known as the Hindu Hrudaysamrat Balasaheb Thackeray Maharashtra Samruddhi Mahamarg was inaugurated on December 11, 2022 by our honourable Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi. The 701-km long access-controlled expressway connects the Capital of Maharashtra (Mumbai) to the Vice Capital (Nagpur)

The current distance between the two cities is well over 800 km, which will be reduced by at least 100 km with the new Samruddhi Mahamarg expressway in place. The time consumed would be reduced substantially from 16 hours to 8 hours for a road trip. The highway will likely have a top-speed limit of 150 kmph, which will help car owners cruise comfortably, reduce the travel time and save fuel along the way.

This is a game changer project and will contribute six per cent to the country's transport and freight traffic and will significantly change the lives of about 40 per cent of the population along the expressway.

Large domestic and foreign factories will be set up on both sides of the expressway, making it convenient to transport agricultural goods from Nagpur to Pune and Mumbai. Tourism will get a big boost along the expressway as well.

Trees will be planted on both sides of the highway to make it a green expressway. Ponds and dams are being constructed along the highway to counter drought in the areas of Vidarbha and Marathwada. 20 wayside amenities will be provided like food hubs, petrol pumps, electric charging ports, parking spaces, trauma centres and ambulance services. Shorter routes are made for the wild animals above and under the highway.

The Intelligent Traffic Management system that will be introduced on the Mumbai Nagpur Samruddhi Expressway will be most tech enabled in the country to be executed by MSRDC will be launched in 2024. This system will be basically used for surveillance, monitoring accidents, response time to mishaps, weather monitoring, toll tax collections and navigation of livestock and wild animals straying on the road.

In short, the highway will benefit farmers and industrialists and attract business investments in a big way in the years to come.

MUMBAI METRO

NEW PHASE OPERATIONAL NOW

Traffic congestion and overcrowding are problems that Mumbai has been facing over the decades. The Mumbai Metro network provides a radical approach for addressing both these issues with a fast, comfortable and technology-driven approach.

Metro has been considered an ideal mode of transportation in most of the leading cities across the globe and this mode of transportation implemented in Mumbai has been an important aspect in making it an international city in the true sense.

Mumbai Metro commenced Phase 1 and became fully operational on June 8, 2014 with Line 1 route starting from D. N. Road to Ghatkopar and vice-versa.

The second Line Phase 2 route namely Route 7 and 2A was flagged out recently by our Honorable Prime Minister on Jan 19, 2023 and open to the public from Jan 20, 2023.

The Line 1, Line 2A & Line 7 integrate very nicely and now the 3 lines coming together ensure North-South & East-West connectivity effectively. Both these new Metro lines 2A & 7 pass through Link Road and Western Express Highway (WEH) and are expected to reduce traffic from these major roads as well as help reduce crowding in existing suburban local train services.

The design of the Metro is very much commuter friendly with air conditioned coaches, motorised sliding automated door that ensure safety, comfort and handicapped access with dedicated space for wheelchair and cycles.

The infrastructure has friendly walkways, elevators and lifts ensuring smooth commuting.

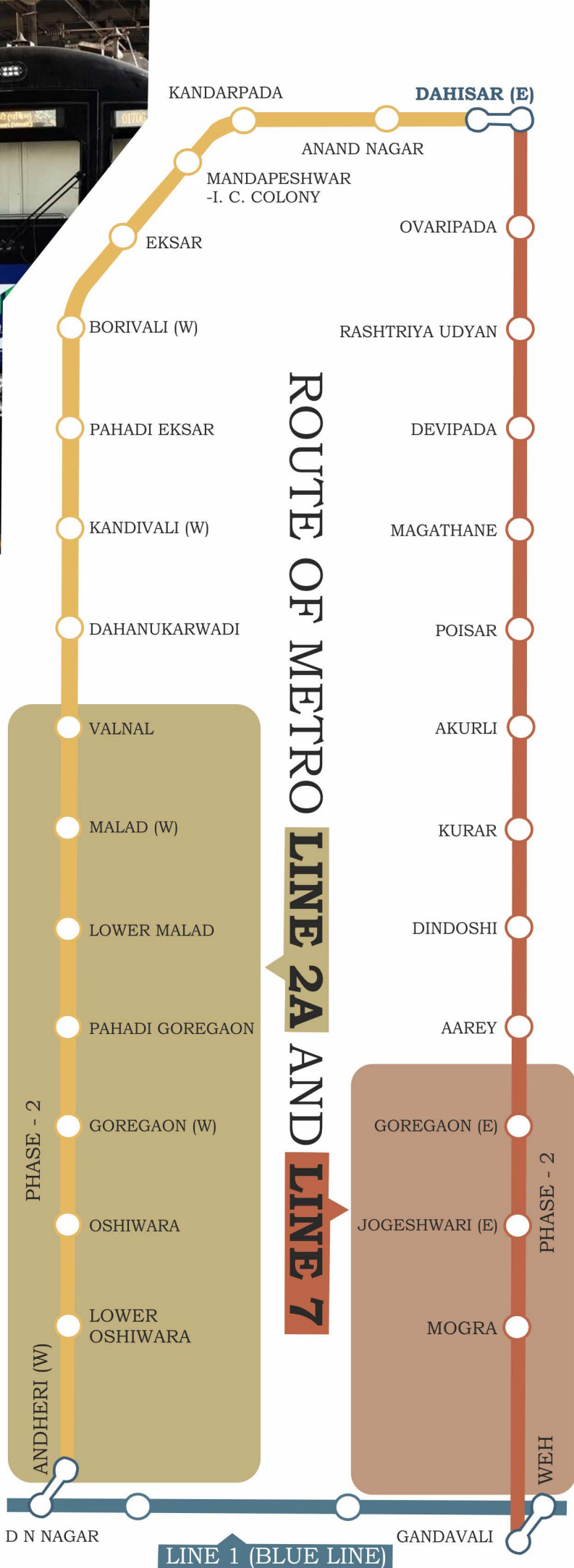
Speaking of fares, it is fairly reasonable, the price of the ticket is ₹ 10 for 3 km, with an additional charge beyond that. For e.g. the fare a distance of 3-12 km will be ₹ 20, for 12-18 km the fare will be ₹ 30. The fare for 18-24 km will be ₹ 40 while that for 24-30 km, the ticket price will be ₹ 50. The ticketing system is manual as well as works with mobile app-based technology making it feasible in every manner.

The Mumbai Metro network is considered eco-friendly due to the fact that the majority of stations of Line 7 which are on Western Express highway falls under the green belt with lots of trees on both sides of the highway.

The metro also has multimodal integration with skywalks equipped with travelators giving access to trains, feeder buses, taxis and autos.

In short Mumbai Metro is the first step towards seamlessly connecting Mumbai from anywhere to anywhere ensuring flexibility and shorter time travelling in an economical fashion.
