Did You Know?

In our busy lives, we never find the time to stop and think about the daily tasks we do. The same is true for religious rituals as well. We never stop to think about why we light a lamp or ring a bell or put flowers on the deities. Woman Power!!

In keeping with the celebrations of the *Centenary year of International Women's Day*, here's a young lady, worthy of being profiled.

Chhavi Rajawat is a new face of rural India who dazzled one and all at the 11th Info-Poverty World Conference held at the United Nations. People were left awe-struck when they realized that she is the sarpanch of Soda village, 60 km from Jaipur, in backward Rajasthan and the changing face of a growing dynamic rural India. The 30-year-old Rajawat, India's youngest and the only MBA to become a village head - the position mostly occupied by elders, quit her senior management position with Bharti-Tele Ventures of Airtel Group to serve her beloved villagers as sarpanch. Rajawat participated in a panel discussion at the two-day meet at the UN on March 24 and 25 on how civil society can implement its actions and spoke on the role of civil society in fighting poverty and promoting development.

She believes in using various strategies of action that includes new technologies like e-services in an era where resources have become limited.

"If India continues to make progress at the same pace as it has for the past 65 years since independence, it just won't be good enough. We'll be failing people who dream about having water, electricity, toilets, schools and jobs. I am convinced we can do it differently and do it faster." She conducts village meetings dressed in jeans and T-shirt in a state where women cover their face with a veil as part of the tradition. Her journey to her roots was not pre-planned and she firmly believes that she is paying back her debt to the village in which she was born, in her own small way.



Logistics News



India's exports rose 37.5% in 2010-II to touch a record \$246 billion as traders targeted new markets and gained from improved sentiments in the US and Europe.

To speed up port capacity expansion projects under the public-private-partnership mode, the ministry of shipping has demanded an exemption from Coastal Regulation Zone authorities in states.

Indian Railways' total earnings for 2010-II have surpassed the target set for the fiscal by about Rs. 100 crore.

Did you know?

The ancient port of Mina (Port) Rashid opened in the early 1970's with a few gantry cranes and limited capacity for container trade. It was expanded in the late 1970's to include more than 30 berths and several of these for large container ships. After assimilating with Jebel Ali, it became a major container port in the UAE while Port Rashid is focused for development as a cruise terminal. Abu Dhabi is the capital city of the UAE.
