The New Year is upon us. It's a time to reflect on all that has happened and look forward to what is coming. Various events have shaped 2011 and made it what it was. Some were good, some could have been better, but all in all, this year saw many significant changes taking place around the globe. Many happenings in business, science and technology, logistics, etc have paved the way for a brighter future. So, read on for a glimpse of the major events in 2011.

The pictures featured are, Saina Nehwal winning the Wilson Swiss Open Grand Prix Gold badminton, F1 debut in India, wedding of Prince William and Kate Middleton, Tunisians voted in their first ever free election, Vallarpadam ICTT, Steve Jobs, Palestine got full membership to the UNESCO, India won the World Cup after 28 years. Anna Hazare, Mary Kom won the Asian Cup Women's Boxing tournament, Saudi Arabian women won the right to vote, Gold prices kept spiraling up, India's imports and exports, India won the Asian Champions Trophy hockey tournament, Three women won the Nobel Peace prize - Ellen Johnson Sirleaf, Leymah Gbowee and Tawakkol Karman, India test-firing a 3,500-km range nuclear-capable Agni-4 missile, Anant Pai of Amar Chitra Katha, South Sudan.



In what turned out to be breaking news across the world, social activist Anna Hazare, became a prominent leader of the anti-corruption movement. He began a hunger strike on April 5th, 2011, to pressurize the Indian government to use a strict anti-corruption law, given in the Jan Lokpal Bill.

Vietnam and India signed a total of six agreements that included joint oil exploration in South China Sea. The agreement was signed during the Vietnamese President Truong Tan Sang's visit to India.

On November 15th 2011, India made a quantum leap in its missile programme, test-firing a 3,500-km range nuclear-capable Agni-4 missile, from an island off Orissa.

In a huge victory for women in Saudi Arabia, King Abdullah of Saudi Arabia granted them the right to vote and run for office in future elections.

Millions of Tunisians voted in their first ever free election, on October 24th. The vote is for the assembly to write a constitution and shape a new government.

Palestine got approval from UNESCO, for a full membership to the organization. The vote makes Palestine the 195th member of UNESCO.

Japan's finance minister Yoshihiko Noda was elected prime minister by parliament, becoming the nation's sixth prime minister in five years.

On October 23rd, Libya officially declared liberation and began the process of electing a government and creating a constitution.



Three billion people watch as Prince William and Kate Middleton tied the knot, on 29th April 2011, at Westminster Abbey in London. On the morning of the wedding, William was named Duke of Cambridge, and his wife becoming Her Royal Highness The Duchess of Cambridge, after the wedding.

After more than 50 years of struggle, the Republic of South Sudan declared its independence and became Africa's 54th state, on 9th July, 2011.



Hina Rabbani Khar was appointed as Pakistan's new foreign minister, becoming the youngest minister to accept the post. She has become an inspiration for women in her country.



It's been a year of revolutions and power to the common man. Celebrations abounded in Egypt after President Hosni Mubarak resigned and handed power to the military on 11th February.



Pope John Paul II was beatified on 1st May 2011, moving him closer to sainthood. A total of 87 international delegations attended the ceremony, including 22 world leaders. One million people gathered for the mass at Saint Peter's Square, to honour this revered man.

The 2011 Nobel Peace Prize was awarded jointly to Ellen Johnson Sirleaf, Leymah Gbowee and Tawakkol Karman "for their non-violent struggle for the safety of women and for women's rights to full participation in peace-building work". Here 's to woman power .

Other Nobel Prize 2011 winners include Dan Shechtman for Chemistry, Saul Perlmutter, Adam Riess, Brian P. Schmidt for Physics and Bruce A. Beutler, Jules A. Hoffmann and Ralph M. Steinman for Physiology or Medicine.



On July 8th, the shuttle Atlantis launched into space for the last time from the Kennedy Space Center. It is the 135th and final flight of the space shuttle program, which started in 1981. For its final mission, the Atlantis is carrying 8,000 lbs of spare parts and supplies to the International Space Station.

Scientists reported early success in a new treatment for leukemia. Three patients with chronic lymphocytic leukemia have responded well to the new treatment which makes the patients' own blood cells seek and destroy their cancer cells.

An international team led by scientists from the Genomics Institute of the Novartis Research Foundation and The Scripps Research Institute has discovered a family of chemical compounds, that could lead to a new generation of anti-malarial drugs, capable of not only alleviating symptoms but also preventing the deadly disease.





In 2011, FEI and Shailaja Nair Foundation organized and participated in several activities that brought the FEI family closer together and also helped the Group contribute towards society in our own effective way.

ICE Awards, 2011

ICE (in-house communication excellence) Awards entered its 3rd consecutive year and proved to be a grand success. Our participant entries came in from varied sectors like corporates, banks, educational institutions, NGO's etc. The event was held on 17th June, 2011, at the MCA recreation centre in Bandra, Mumbai and was well attended by several dignitaries. The Guests of honour included Ms. Shailaja Girkar, Mumbai's deputy Mayor and Ms. Prema Mammen Mathew, editor of Vanitha, India's widely circulated women's magazine. Shri Gopinath Muthukad, world renowned magician who was bestowed the Merlin award, was also honored, on this occasion and wowed the audience with his spectacular, magical performance.

She The Incredible

To commemorate the centenary celebrations of International Women's day, Shailaja Nair Foundation published a book, titled She The Incredible, on 99 Indian women who've inspired others to follow in their footsteps. This book, edited by Shri P. K. Ravindranath, a veteran journalist, was released, on June 17th, by Ms. Shailaja Girkar and the first copy was received by Ms. Prema Mammen Mathew.

FEI's annual Founder's Day celebrations took place on June 24th, in honour of our beloved founder-director, Mrs. Shailaja Nair. The evening began with a talk by Sister Deepa of the Brahmakumari Organization. It was followed by a musical nite, with Anup Jalota's soulful music.

Other top earners and box office Hollywood hits included Pirates of the Caribbean, X Men first class, Hangover 2, Transformers, Sherlock Holmes, Kung Fu Panda 2, etc.

The King's Speech won the best picture award at the Oscars 2011.

Other top scoring movies at this years Oscars were The Social Network, Black Swan, and Inception.

One of Hollywood's greatest icons Dame Elizabeth Taylor breathed her last on 23/3/2011 due to congestive heart failure. The 79 year old actress had been in the public eye for six decades having won three academy awards and has acted in over 50 films.

The most eagerly awaited 'Breaking Dawn' Part 1, released in November 2011, drew flak from critics, but fans can't seem to get enough of the Twilight Saga and are looking forward to Part 2.

Music

A. R. Rahman was nominated for Best Original Score and Best Original Song at the Oscars, for the film '127 hours'.

Famous Ghazal singer Shri. Jagjit Singh breathed his last this year, but will be immortalized through his soulful music.

Popular international artists this year were Lady Gaga, Justin Bieber, Katy Perry, Selena Gomez, Bruno Mars, etc.

The music world lost a star, the award-winning, internationally known singer-songwriter Amy Winehouse.

Judy McGrath, the chief executive of MTV Networks resigned after 30 years, ending the tenure of one of the most powerful women in television.

Recognition for existing writers has also provided a much needed boost. The world is once again waking up to the fact that books are a man's best companions.

The awards for the 45th and 46th Jnanpith for the years 2009 and 2010 respectively, were announced on 20 September, 2011. The 45th award was jointly conferred on Hindi litterateurs Amar Kant and Shrilal Shukla, and the 46th on the Kannada litterateur Chandrashekhara Kambara.



Tomas Tranströmer, born in 1931, is a noteworthy writer and poet from Sweden, who won the 2011 Nobel Prize in Literature. His poems have a religious element and his famous works include *The Great Enigma*.

Jennifer Egan is a novelist and short story writer from the United States. She is the winner of the 2011 Pulitzer Prize for Fiction for her novel *A Visit From the Goon Squad*. This work also brought her the National Book Critics Circle Award.



Siddhartha Mukherjee, an Indian-American physician won the prestigious 2011 Pulitzer prize in the general non-fiction category, for his book on cancer, *The Emperor of All Maladies: A Biography of Cancer*.

Kay Ryan, an American poet born in 1945, won the Pulitzer Prize for Poetry for *The Best of It: New and Selected Poems*. Her poems are known for its wit and use of rhyme and rhythm.



Julian Barnes is the winner of this year's £ 50,000 Man Booker Prize for Fiction 2011, for *The Sense of an Ending*. Born in 1946 in England, he has several novels and awards to his credit. He is a well known writer in the crime fiction genre.

Philip Roth was announced as winner of the Man Booker International Prize 2011. He is an award-winning American novelist, who has also won the National Book Critics Circle award, the PEN/Faulkner Award and the Pulitzer Prize, in the past.

A country's progress has always been determined by the wheels of economy. Thus the latest happenings in the business world, is always of keen interest to people. We highlight a few important events, that turned the economic tides around in 2011.

Steve Jobs, the visionary co-founder and CEO of Apple died on October 5, 2011 at the age of 56 after fighting an eight year battle with pancreatic cancer. He was primarily responsible for spearheading the advent of the iMac, iTunes, iPod, iPhone, and iPad. His role in turning around the company into the electronics powerhouse of today is well-documented.



Google took another step towards head to head competition with its main rival Apple by acquiring Motorola Mobility for \$ 12.5 billion on Aug 15, 2011. Google is known for being a search engine and also has Android phone software, but this deal also gives the company access to 17,000 patents owned by Motorola Mobility.

For the first time in history, the U.S. had its credit rating lowered. Credit agency, Standard & Poor's lowered the nation's credit rating from the top grade of AAA to AA+, removing the country from its list of risk-free borrowers.



A coin of Rs.150 denomination was released by Finance Minister Pranab Mukherjee in New Delhi on February 26, 2011 to conclude the celebrations to mark 150 years of India's Income Tax Department. The coin will have an international design with Satyameva Jayate and India on the front side and a portrait of Chanakya and lotus with honeybee on the reverse.

On November 18, 2011, India was re-elected to the International Law Commission for a five year term beginning January 1, 2012.

Coal India, a rank newcomer in the elite list of 30 companies, that constitutes the sensex, replaced Reliance Industries Ltd., on 17 August 2011, as the most valued Indian company. The nearly four-decade-old Kolkata-headquartered Coal India currently boasts of a market capitalization of Rs 2.5 lakh crore.

GVK Airport Holdings Private Limited, a subsidiary of GVK Power & Infrastructure Limited, on 18 October 2011, acquired 10,80,00,000 equity shares worth Rs. 10 each (amounting to a 13.5% equity stake) in Mumbai International Airport Pvt Ltd.

The much awaited Mobile Number Portability finally kicked off, allowing subscribers to change their service providers, while still retaining the same number. The MNP service was launched in Haryana and soon spread across India. It was inaugurated by the Union Minister of Communications & IT, Mr. Kapil Sibal.





This industry has grown in leaps and bounds in India and abroad and is poised for even more growth in the coming years. The Indian government has planned a slew of ambitious projects across different sectors of the industry.



India has set a target to more than double its merchandise exports to \$ 500 billion in the next three years.

According to new research, the Arabian Gulf Countries are shifting their trade and investment emphasis to emerging markets, like Asia.

India has joined the global cruise line club with its first cruise ship, AMET Majesty, registered with an Indian Flag.

Infrastructure work on the Rs. 9,000-crore Vizhinjam International Container Transshipment Terminal, has finally gone ahead. The port is said to be one of the world's deepest ports, with a natural depth of 24 metres.

Vallarpadam ICTT, India's first international container transshipment terminal, close to Kochi port, is looking at development of facilities for handling mother container ships of 8000 plus TEU capacities.

Despite having shortage of modern equipment, Chittagong port, secured top position in terms of efficiency among 69 ports of 17 countries in Asia.

India's new, ambitious, dedicated western freight corridor project will connect Mumbai to Delhi. The Rs. 4,23,000 crore project involves building of 9 large industrial zones, high-speed freight line, 3 ports, 6 airports, a 6 lane intersection-free expressway connecting Mumbai with Delhi and a 4,000 MW power plant.

Did you know?

In 1819, Sir Stamford Raffles led the British East India Company in creating the Port of Singapore trading post on the international spice route. When the Suez Canal was opened in 1869 and steamships arrived on the scene, sea-borne trade in the Port of Singapore began to increase. A period of prosperity began and construction of port facilities began anew.





The Indian cricket team came up with an inspired performance against Sri Lanka in the final, to lift the World Cup in Mumbai on 2/4/2011, bringing to an end the 28-year wait, when Kapil's Devils had last lifted the cup in 1983.

The cricketing world lost a luminary on 22 September 2011, Mansur Ali Khan Pataudi, a batsman par excellence and the youngest captain of the Indian cricket team.

Wisden, regarded as the Bible of cricket, named India's Master blaster Sachin Tendulkar, as the seventh recipient of the award. He joined the league of other recipients like Ricky Ponting, Shane Warne, Muttiah Muralitharan, Jacques Kallis, and Andrew W Flintoff, etc.



India defeated Pakistan 4-2 in the inaugural Asian Champions Trophy hockey tournament.



India's Rohan Bopanna and Pakistan's Aisam-ul-Haq Qureshi won the Stockholm Open men's doubles title on 23 October 2011.

Serbian tennis player Novak Djokovic won his first Wimbledon title by beating defending champion Rafael Nadal, making Djokovic the top ranked player in the world.

Chinese Tennis Player Li Na became the first Asian to win a Grand Slam Singles Title, when she won the French Open.

FOOTBALL

Germany hosted the 2011 FIFA Women's World Cup where 845,711 fans attended 32 matches to watch 16 teams battle for the trophy. In the final, Japan defeated USA in a post-match penalty kick shoot-out.

Former Brazilian striker Ronaldo announced his retirement from soccer on February 14.



The Indian Grand Prix (sometimes referred to as the Grand Prix of India) is a race in the calendar of the FIA Formula One World Championship. This year's venue was the Buddh International Circuit in Greater Noida, Uttar Pradesh, India. The first event took place on 30 October 2011 as the 17th race of the 2011 Formula One season, and the inaugural race was won by Germany's Sebastian Vettel.



World Champion Viswanathan Anand played against Magnus Carlsen of Norway to end the match in a hard fought draw and finished second in the Bilbao Final Masters chess tournament. But the icing on the cake was when the Indian ace dethroned Carlsen from the number one ranking in Live rating list, for the first time since January this year and ended up as the top player in ratings too.



India's badminton ace Saina Nehwal won her first title of 2011 with a victory over South Korean Sung Ji Hyun, in the Wilson Swiss Open Grand Prix Gold badminton at Basil on 20/3/2011.

Chef's Corner

Here's a recipe for Chocolate Walnut Fudge to pamper your taste buds this Christmas.

Ingredients:

1 tin condensed milk
1 tin water (same measure as the condensed milk)
1 ½ tablespoon of cocoa powder
½ tin sugar
½ cup crushed walnut
50 gms butter



Method:

Empty the condensed milk, water, sugar and cocoa in the vessel. Stir continuously over slow fire. Please be sure to stir continuously otherwise it will stick to the bottom of the vessel. Once it bubbles put the butter and stir. When the paste is half thickened add walnuts. Stir continuously. When the mixture starts leaving the sides of the vessel grease a plate with butter and pour mixture. Allow it to cool and then cut.
