SHRI KRISHNA ASKED DURYODHANA 5 VILLAGES

FOR THE PANDAVAS-FIND OUT WHERE THEY ARE NOW

In the epic Mahabharata, one of the most significant events is the request made by Shri Krishna for five villages from Duryodhana on behalf of the Pandavas.

The Five Villages and Their Modern Locations



Indraprastha

Panipat

Modern Location: Panipat is located in Haryana, India, approximately 90 kilometers from Delhi. It is renowned for its historical battles and continues to be an important city in modern times.



Tilpat

WHAT ARE CC, BHP, NM AND RPM IN A CAR ENGINE AND WHAT IS THEIR FUNCTION?

Whenever you buy a car, bike, or any other vehicle, the first thing that comes to mind is the engine. The engine is the heart of any vehicle, and without it, no vehicle can function.

But when you buy a new vehicle, many times there is not much information about the technical parts of the engine, which can cause trouble in choosing the right option. Therefore, it is important to know some important things about the engine, so that you can make a better decision.



What is CC

(Cubic Capacity)?

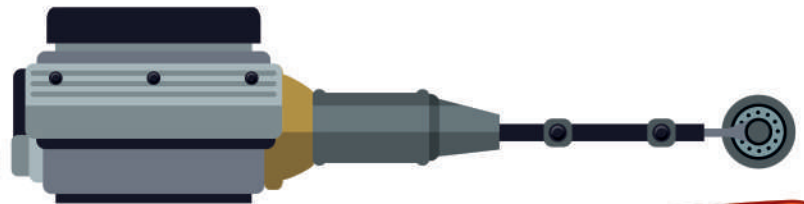
CC stands for Cubic Capacity, and it indicates the capacity of the engine. When you talk about the engine of a vehicle, CC is mentioned. For example, if the engine of a car is 1000 cc, it means that the cylinder of that engine has a space of 1000 cubic centimeters. The higher the CC, the larger the cylinder capacity of the engine. An engine with a higher CC also has a greater capacity to consume air and fuel, which improves the performance of the vehicle.



What is BHP

(Brake Horsepower)?

BHP stands for Brake Horsepower, and it is used to measure the power of an engine. In simple words, BHP tells how much power your engine can produce. Small cars usually have a power of 100 to 120 BHP, while mid-size cars can have 120 to 200 BHP. High-performance cars have even more BHP. The higher the BHP, the faster the vehicle will run and the more powerful it will be.



What is RPM

(Revolutions Per Minute)?

RPM means Revolution Per Minute. It tells how many times the crankshaft in the engine rotates in a minute. The number of times the piston in the vehicle's engine moves up and down in a minute is measured through RPM. A higher RPM means that the engine is generating more power. The power that the engine generates reaches the vehicle's tires through the gear, which increases the speed of the vehicle. When you buy a new vehicle, it is very important to know about these technical parts of the engine. This will not only help you make the right choice, but no one will be able to fool you by giving you wrong information. By knowing the correct meaning of terms like CC, BHP, N, M, and RPM, you can understand the performance of your vehicle and choose the right engine according to your needs.



What is NM

(Newton Meter)?

NM means Newton Meter, and it measures the torque of the car's engine. Torque is the force that is required to rotate something. In simple words, Nm tells how much power the engine has to pull the vehicle. When you press the accelerator of the car, the engine generates power, which moves the vehicle forward. The slight jerk felt during this is called torque. The higher the torque, the more force the engine will pull the vehicle.

Today, we can see several cars in the country be it from Maruti or Tata. Due to globalisation, even foreign companies sell their variety of cars in India.

But do you know who built the first car factory in India? He is Walchand Hirachand Doshi, an Indian genius and industrialist, who founded Walchand Group.

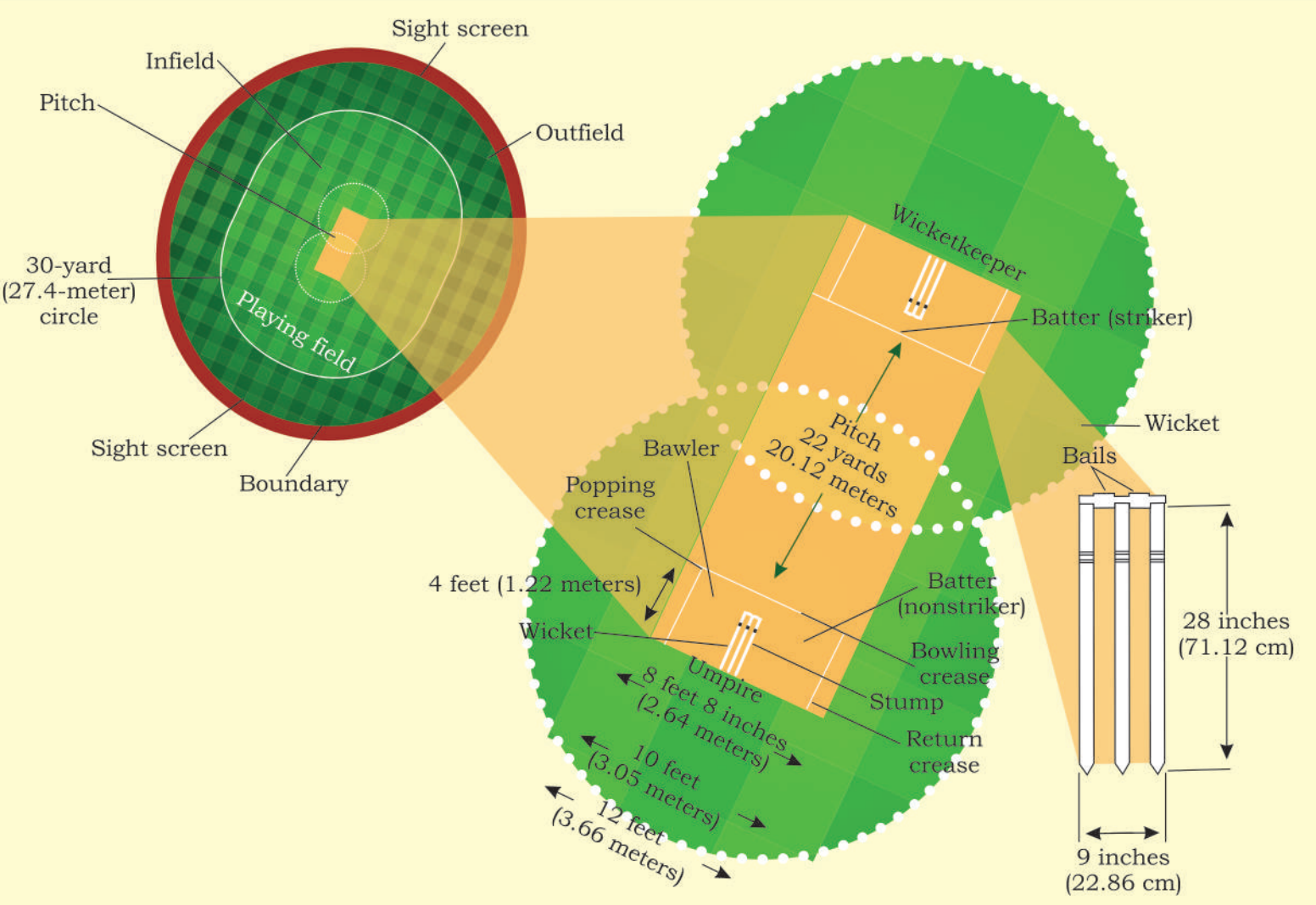
Born in 1882 in Solapur, Maharashtra, Walchand established Premier Automobiles near Mumbai in 1945. The first car rolled out of his factory in 1949. He is called the 'Father of transportation in India'. Not just that, Hirachand also established the first modern shipyard and first aircraft factory in India.

He later earned a BA degree from the University of Mumbai and joined his family business after his graduation.

Hirachand was initially engaged in cotton trading and money lending. But after a few years, he realised he was not interested in the family business. Hence, he decided to quit and became a railway contractor for construction-related work in partnership with a former railway clerk.

Later, he became a contractor in other departments of government. As a contractor engaged in construction, his biggest customer was the British government. However, he supported the Indian independence movement. By 1947, the Walchand group of companies was one of the 10 largest business houses in the country. He suffered a stroke in 1949 and retired from business the next year. He was looked after by his wife Kasturbai in his last years. He passed away in April 1953 in Gujarat.





TRAFFIC POLICE PULL YOU OVER? DON'T BE A SITTING DUCK! KNOW YOUR RIGHTS.



Common Man's Rights When Traffic Police Pull You Over:

Have you ever been stopped by traffic police? You probably have. The traffic police ensure smooth traffic flow and make sure that traffic rules are followed on the road.

Traffic police often conduct checks at various locations and issue challans to vehicles that violate traffic rules. Here are the rights you have if you are stopped by traffic police.

Identity Card: If the traffic police stop your vehicle, you can ask to see their identification if they are not wearing it. If they refuse to show their IDs, you can decline to show your car documents.

Driving License: You need to show your driving license if asked, as per section 130 of the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988. However, you can refuse to hand it over to the officer if you do not want to.

Receipt For Document Confiscation: If the traffic police take your driving license, car insurance, or other documents, ask for a receipt. The police must issue a receipt for any confiscated documents.

Objection To Towing: If someone is in the car, you can object to it being towed. The police cannot tow a car with someone inside.

Case Of Harassment: If you feel harassed unnecessarily by the traffic police, you can file a complaint to the authorities. You have the right to do so.

Challan: You can refuse a challan if the traffic officer does not have an e-challan generator or a valid government-issued challan book.

Use Of Force: You have the right to stay in your vehicle. The traffic police cannot force you out of your car or take your keys from the ignition.

NIRF Rankings 2024 List: The Ministry of Education has unveiled the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) 2024 today. IIT-Madras has once again secured the top positions in both the engineering and overall categories, while IISc Bengaluru is ranked as the leading university in the country.

A total of 10,885 higher education institutions participated this year, a significant increase from last year's 5,543 institutions. This year's ninth edition introduces three new categories: open universities, skill universities, and state-funded government universities.
